Emergency closure procedures

And finally, as the nights draw in and the weather begins to make the news, the following is a reminder of our emergency closure procedures:

Most years we manage to avoid closure but the variety of localities our pupils come from means that some transport routes become unmanageable. Your transport providers will decide if specific routes are too hazardous. The decision about school closure is based on local school conditions and especially safety prior to and on site. They may be different to your local conditions but please be assured that we make every effort to keep our school up and running.

In the case of complete or partial closure announcements are made on local radio – BBC Radio Cambridgeshire (details can also be found on their website) Heart Radio and Star FM; details are also available through the County Council website (www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk)

Although not a requirement we endeavour to notify all transport providers. For pupils who are transported by their parent to school the form tutor will be asked to call as soon as we know the situation.

A closure notice will also be posted on the school website (www.granta.cambs.sch.uk)

If the school is open when there is snow in the area we keep a close eye on the forecast and make an assessment as to the safety for transporting pupils home. If it is determined that the school needs to close early we will contact the transport and also all families to ensure that there is a person available to meet their child on arrival. The County Council website does update the school status during the day with information about early closures etc. The local radio stations also try to announce any changes when they get them so please keep listening.
