Exam results

We had some very pleasing exam results this summer. As a group our oldest pupils achieved life and living skill modules, results in English, Maths, Science and ICT, Jamie Oliver cooking course certificates and bronze, silver and gold Duke of Edinburgh awards. Most of our leavers have gone on to college: to West Suffolk College, Cambridgeshire Regional College, College of West Anglia and Huntingdon. Very well done to them all and I know that our leaver and certificate assemblies are a source of great inspiration to our younger pupils.

School site

We have had a significant amount of work carried out on our school building over the summer as well as our usual cleaning schedules and hosting two play schemes (one for Action for Children and one for Cambridgeshire Joint Play Schemes.) I hope you will approve that we have installed solar panels to help reduce our costs and carbon footprint and these will help with lighting within the school and with heating our pool water. We now have wifi throughout the school which will greatly help our ICT provision in lessons.
