The app has lots of areas, including sections for ADHD, anxiety, soothing animated videos and a set of sessions called "Sleepy Time for Kids" to create a mindful bedtime routine.

To help keep your child safe online, we'd like to introduce you to the Qustodio App. It's free for controlling just one device and designed for parents to be able to supervise and manage their child's device use. You can download it onto their phone, ipad and/or desktop (you have to pay for more than device) and then manage those devices from your own Smartphone. You can block content and games, set time limits on apps or the internet and view their calls and texts.
