For some pupils this will also develop water confidence.</li> <li>• A session in the adventure room, pushing/pulling soft play equipment.</li> </ul> <p><b>Fine motor development</b>                      Your pupils will have a weekly lesson around developing fine motors skills, which will include dough disco, cutting skills and a range of funky finger activities.</p> <p><b>Ways to help at home:</b>                      Encourage your pupils to pick and release small objects using thumb and index fingers, stacking wooden blocks, threading lego etc, developing their fine motor skills.</p> <p><b><u>Second half of the term</u></b>  <b>Gross motor development:</b>                      Your Pupils will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have two PE lessons a week focusing on African dance and fine motor write dance.</li> <li>• A swimming lesson developing their gross motor strength and floating/swimming movements.
