

Penguin Class: Additional Home Learning Ideas

English:

Read lots of books with your child. Discuss the pictures. Ask Who? What? Where? and 'What is she/ he doing? questions.

Make marks on paper using crayons or chunky markers. Get them to copy lines, triangles, crosses, circles and squares. Let them trace outside your shapes and inside your shapes. Bubble write their name for them and let them write inside the letters.

Maths:

Please play dice and card games with your child.

Show them a playing card with a number on it. Get them to put that number of things in an empty egg box. Show them another number. Add more objects. How many do you have?

Please get them to match socks, and count objects around the house.

Play shop with them or encourage them to play shop with other children in the house.

Measure out ingredients when cooking in the kitchen.

See if they can find daisies, ivy and plants that we eat in the kitchen. <u>Make sure they do not eat any</u> of the outdoor flowers/ daffodils or ivy. Wash hands after touching.



Art:

Colour Hunt: Get them to colour hunt around the house- find one colour per day and collect them on a mat or rug.

Food Technology and Life Skills:

Help to prepare snacks and meals. Help to set the table, wash up and put away. Help with the gardening and sorting the laundry. Help with dusting and hoovering.
